CITROËN CUSTOMERS SET TO BENEFIT FROM GOVERNMENT CHANGES

With the news from the budget that the most environmentally conscious cars will benefit from reduced vehicle excise duty (VED), Citroën drivers are set to benefit more than most.

More than two thirds of Citroen's cars, and 90% of the C1, C2 and C3 model ranges, fall into the B* and C** bands and will benefit from an annual reduction in Vehicle Excise Duty of £35 and £5 respectively.

Managing Director of Citroën UK, Xavier Duchemin, said "Many Citroën owners will be better off because of the changes in the Budget, and this further justifies our fundamental commitment to developing economical and environmentally friendly cars. Today, Citroën cars are amongst the best for low CO2 emissions."

Citroën environmental credentials are backed by a range of low CO2 models that includes the three most economical and cleanest diesel cars in the UK, with the C1, C2 and C3 all of which achieve better than 65mpg in official tests. In addition, the Company offers a range of innovative technology that includes the clever Stop & Start system and diesel particulate filters.
